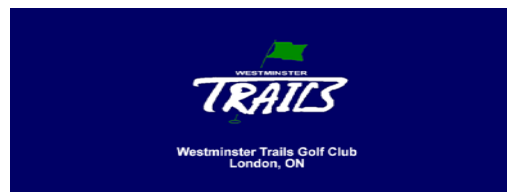

Canadian Deaf Golf Association's History

The Establishment of CDGA

In 1993, the first Canadian Deaf Golf Championship (CDGC) founded by Robert Cundy of Alberta because there was no national organization for deaf golfers in Canada while some nations: Australia, Scotland, England, and the USA had emerging or established organizations. Also at the same time, Cundy was involved with those nations in creating World Deaf Golf Championship (WDGC). The first national championship was used as a medium to select best golfers for the World Deaf Golf Championship and encourage the sport of golf in the deaf community of Canada.

Cundy and Tim Mallach of Ontario established the Canadian Deaf Golf Association in 1997. Cundy and Mallach were the first officers of the newly established organization as President and Vice President respectively; Grant Underschultz was the first Treasurer. There were no positions for secretary and provincial directors until 2001.

The mandate of CDGA is to develop the golf program nationally and recruit best Canadian golfers for the World Deaf Golf Championships.
